Hypertext Markup Language (HTML) is the most common language for creating documents on the World Wide Web.

HTML uses various tags to define a layout for web pages, most tags require an opening <tag> and a closing </tag>.

You can write your code and then test it before adding it to your Kahootz page.


This article covers basic HTML to help you with simple coding within your Kahootz site.

How To Apply

If you wish to apply HTML coding to the platform, you can do so in two different ways.

1. When you choose to customise a page or enter text within a web page etc, basically when you see this ribbon bar.



Simply select "Tools > Source Code" from the drop-down menu, and you'll be able to enter any code. Don't forget to save it.



2. When adding a widget ie: Applet on the Dashboard

FYI: Applets are disabled by default for security reasons, so contact your Site Owners if you cannot add
